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BLS (Basic Life Support)

In this classroom-based course, healthcare professionals learn to recognize several life-threatening emergencies, provide Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) to victims of all ages, use an Automatic External Defibrillator (AED), and relieve choking in a safe, timely and effective manner. Certification is provided by the American Heart Association (AHA)

ACLS (Advanced Cardiac Life Support)

In this classroom-based course, providers enhance their skills in treating adult victims of cardiac arrest or other cardiopulmonary emergencies, while earning their AHA ACLS for Healthcare Providers course completion card.

ACLS EP (Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support Experienced Provider)

The goal of the ACLS EP course is to improve outcomes in complex cardiovascular, respiratory and other (i.e. metabolic, toxicologic) emergencies by expanding on core ACLS guidelines and encouraging critical thinking and decision-making strategies.

PHTLS (Pre-Hospital Trauma Life Support)

With certification provided by the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians (NAEMT), PHTLS courses improve the quality of trauma care and decrease mortality. The program is based on a prehospital trauma care philosophy, stressing the treatment of the multi-system trauma patient as a unique entity with specific needs. This may require an approach to the trauma patient that varies from traditional treatment modalities. PHTLS promotes critical thinking as the foundation for providing quality care. It is based on the belief that, given a good fund of knowledge and key principles, Emergency Medical Services (EMS) practitioners are capable of making reasoned decisions regarding patient

care. The PHTLS course is continuously updated and revised to keep up with the advances in the field. Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS) Guidelines and feedback from PHTLS participants.

TCCC (Tactical Combat Casualty Care)

With certification provided by the NAEMT, the TCCC course introduces evidence-based, life-saving techniques and strategies for providing the best trauma care on the battlefield. Detente conducts TCCC courses under the auspices of its NAEMT PHTLS program, the recognized world leader in prehospital trauma education. TCCC courses use the PHTLS military textbook and are fully compliant with the U.S. Department of Defense's Committee on Tactical Combat Casualty Care (CoTCCC) guidelines. It is the only TCCC course endorsed by the American College of Surgeons.

FENIX III/MPHTLS (Military Pre-hospital Trauma Life Support)

This 6-day course provides participants with the NAEMT PHTLS and TCCC in one sitting. Additional topics include thoracostomy, resuscitative thoracostomy, fasciotomy, cricothyroidotomy and emergency escharotomy in patients with constrictive burns and damage control in the tactical and emergency settings.

FP-C (Flight Paramedic-Certified)

This course provides participants with a comprehensive review of complex topics such as patient management and stabilization, safety fundamentals and ground transportation, Federal Aviation Regulations (FAR) Part 135, survival and flight safety standards, Commission on Accreditation of Medical Transport Systems (CAMTS), critical cardiac patient, respiratory management, acid/base balance, ventilator management, neurological patient management, toxic exposures, environmental emergencies, emergency obstetrics, neonatal and pediatric emergencies, burns, flight physiology, hemodynamic monitoring and general management of critically ill patients. It prepares participants to challenge the FP-C examination as administered by the Board for Critical Care Transport Paramedic Certification (BCCTPC).

TP-C (Tactical Paramedic - Certified)

This course provides participants with a comprehensive review of complex topics such as patient management and stabilization outlined by the CoTCCC. The course covers the following criteria: TCCC, hemorrhage control, advanced airway techniques, medication administration, tactical team operations, rescue/extraction, legal aspects, incident command, canine management, force protection, neurological emergencies, mission planning and CBRNE. It prepares students to challenge the TP-C examination as administered by the BCCTPC.

CCP-C (Critical Care Paramedic - Certified)

This course provides participants with a comprehensive review of complex topics such as patient management and stabilization, safety fundamentals and ground transportation, critical cardiac patient, respiratory management, acid/base balance, ventilator management, neurological patient management, toxic exposures, environmental emergencies, emergency obstetrics, neonatal and pediatric emergencies, burn management, hemodynamic monitoring and general management of critically ill patients. It prepares students to challenge the CCP-C examination as administered by the BCCTPC.

CCEMT-P (Critical Care Emergency Medical Transport Program)

The CCEMT-P course is designed to prepare paramedics and nurses to function as members of a critical care transport team. The program attempts to bridge the gap between pre-hospital and in-hospital care, resulting in a specialized provider who has both the understanding of the aspects of caring for a critically ill patient and has the ability to provide the highest level of care to the critically ill patient during transport. Certification comes from the University of Maryland Baltimore (UMBC) and the course must be administered in the USA.

RIT (Rapid Intervention Team)

The 3-day RIT is the most complete course

available for the development, training and implementation of an RIT program. The program consists of 3 modules being (1) Firefighter Survival (2) Firefighter Rescue and (3) RIT Operations. The program covers all aspects outlined in National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) Standard 1407 for RIT crews training.

Confined Space Technical Rescue

This 5-day course covers a subset of technical rescue operations that involves the rescue and recovery of victims trapped in a confined space or in a place only accessible through confined spaces, such as underground vaults, storage silos, storage tanks and sewers.

High-Angle Rescue

This 5-day course presents instruction on the complete skills set for administering practical double rope rescue skills and wilderness medicine in the vertical setting. Participants will be well practiced in personal safety systems, natural anchors, ascending/descending and low angle and vertical rescue operations at course completion.

Swiftwater Rescue

This 5-day course provides rescuers with the fundamentals of survival in moving water and is recommended for anyone who may be called upon to effect in-water rescues. Participants gain knowledge in hydrology and river classifications, size-up, site control and scene management. Practical skills include self-rescue, swiftwater swimming and the fundamentals of shore, boat and in-water rescues. Additionally, participants are introduced to the basics of boat handling and the fundamentals of rope rescue including mechanical advantage and anchor systems. This course also provides the foundation of the Swiftwater Rescue Technician training level. Swiftwater Rescue Technician is a mandatory training level for inclusion on a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Swiftwater/Flood Search and Rescue Team at all team levels.

Fast Rope and Rappel

This 10-day course is designed to develop and enhance participant rope abilities. Topics covered include but are not limited to tower training, fast rope techniques, individual and equipment safety checks, rappelling from 20' to 90', fast rope from 20' to 50', mechanical

descenders, self-belay techniques, utilizing a figure 8, primary knots, rigging, gear and technology, global operations and effectively and safely running a point on the rappel towers as well as the fast rope.

SERE (Survival, Evasion, Resistance and Escape)

SERE teaches participants everything they need to know to do just that. From how they build shelters to procuring water, to land navigation to evasion, participants learn skills that could be the difference in getting them home safely. SERE B is a 5-day course and SERE C is a full 21-day course with practical exercises and a Final Training Exercise (FTX).

Tactical Tracking Level I, II and Combined K9

Tactical Tracking Levels I and II are delivered by former Special Operations instructors with real operational experience and intended for military and police agencies. The benefit of this training is enhanced individual and team safety in both rural and urban areas. Combined tracker teams are quicker, tactically more flexible and provide both visual and scent tracking capabilities for difficult scenarios. Level I is a 5-day course and focuses on individual tracking skills, tactics and tracking formations. Level II is a 5-day course that focuses on tactical team scenarios, night tracking, counter-tracking techniques, surveillance and live fire drills. Combined K-9 adds 5 days to the Level II iteration and combines a 5-man visual tracking team with a dog team and the safest, quickest and most efficient tracking methods suitable for tracking High Value Targets (HVTs).

Introduction to Psychological Operations

This course introduces participants to the techniques used to alter the behavior of foreign populations in a manner consistent with diplomatic, national security and foreign policy objectives. 14 days in length, the course develops Psychological Operations Specialists on assessing the information needs of a target population, and developing and delivering the right message at the right time and place to create an intended result.
